213. ASSESSMENT OF STUDENT PROGRESS

1. Purpose

The Executive Council recognizes that a system of assessing student achievement can help the student, teachers and parents/guardians to better assess the student's progress toward personal educational goals.

2. Guidelines

Grading

Grading shall be that system of measuring and recording student progress and achievement which enables the student, parents/guardians and teachers to learn the student's strengths and weaknesses and to plan an educational and vocational future for the student in the areas of the greatest potential for success.

Such grades shall measure the student's progress against both his/her own potential for achievement and the achievements of others in the class as appropriate to the grade level and subject matter.

3. Authority SC 1531, 1532 Title 22 Sec. 4.11, 4.51, 4.52 213-R The Executive Council directs that the instructional program of the school includes a system of assessing for all students, which is consistent with the educational goals of the school.

The school shall provide for the development and continual analysis of student portfolios. Such portfolios may include:

- 1. Mastery Report.
- 2. Industry certifications.
- 3. Resumé.
- 4. Awards and recognitions.
- 5. Products, e.g. pictures, artwork, videos, PowerPoint, storybook, web page, business plan.
- 6. Career Technical Student Organizations (CTSO) activities.

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	7. Other demonstrations or performances by students related to specific student learning outcomes.
	8. Examinations developed by teachers to assess specific student learning outcomes.
	9. Diagnostic assessments.
	10. Other measures, as appropriate, which may include standardized tests.
4. Delegation of Responsibility	The Director or a designee shall develop procedures for assessment which include the following:
	Each student should know what end result and achievements are expected at the outset of any course of study.
	2. Each student should be kept informed of his/her personal progress during the course of a unit of study.
	3. Methods of assessing shall be appropriate to the course of study and the maturity of students.
	4. Assessment should objectively evaluate and reward students for their efforts.
	5. Students should be encouraged to assess their own achievements.
	6. All assessment systems are subject to continual review and revisions.
