1.	Purpose	The Executive Council recognizes its responsibility to provide a quality education to all students and shall support the sending districts appropriate planned instructional program for identified students whose dominant language is not English.

3.	Delegation of Responsibility	The Director or designee shall implement and supervise the ELL instruction in compliance with federal and state laws and regulations.
4.	Guidelines 20 U.S.C. Sec. 6801 et seq	The school shall cooperate with the sending school districts to provide ELL support for an identified student.
	20 U.S.C. Sec. 1703	Students participating in ELL programs shall have access to and be encouraged to participate in extracurricular activities available in the school.
	20 U.S.C. Sec. 6801 et seq	Students participating in ELL programs shall be required, with accommodations, to meet established standards and competency requirements adopted by the Executive Council.
	Pol. 404, 433	Certified professional employees and appropriate support staff shall implement the ELL program.

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20 U.S.C. Sec. 6801 et seq	Parents/Guardians will be regularly apprised of their student's progress. Communications with parents/guardians shall be in the language understood by the parents/guardians, whenever possible. The school shall maintain an effective means of outreach to encourage parental involvement in the education of their children.
