Middle Bucks Institute of Technology Students Earn Silver Medals at SkillsUSA National Competitions

Jamison, PA – Students from various technical schools throughout the United States, including Middle Bucks Institute of Technology (MBIT), competed in the 2023 SkillsUSA National Competitions held in Atlanta, Georgia. MBIT had three gold medal winners from the state competition that advanced to the nationals to represent Pennsylvania. Culinary Arts & Science (CUA) student Alexander Lopez from Central Bucks East participated in the Restaurant Service competition. Multimedia Technology (MMT) students Christian Pearson from Central Bucks East and Samantha Rosinski from Central Bucks South participated as a team in the Digital Cinema Production competition and placed 2nd at the national level. Congratulations to Christian Pearson and Samantha Rosinski for winning silver medals! Christian was unable to attend the National Competition therefore fellow Multimedia Technology student Emma Hancock filled in for him.

Christian Pearson shared "It was such a fun experience making this film. I need to thank everyone involved. Their talent, dedication, and professionalism shined through. The prompt given to us was to make an uplifting film. We told a story about compromise using inspiration from my own personal filmmaking experience. I will continue to use these experiences while obtaining my degree in Film and Media Studies at Temple University." Samantha Rosinski continued "This experience is something to add to our resume. We are both working towards a career in film production, so national recognition certainly helps."

The Multimedia Technology program at MBIT has won regional, state, and national competitions. For the first time ever, student teams produced the competition film prior to going to nationals allowing them to use additional students in their crew. In true Hollywood filmmaking style. The film prompt stipulated that the movies had to be produced as a *feel-good* genre in the style of Francis Ford Coppola, the director of *Tucker*. Moreover, students were not permitted any assistance from an instructor. Films were made 100% by students. This is the second consecutive year that MBIT Multimedia students took second place at nationals and the fifth year that MMT students placed in the top five at nationals.
